
IBBR 2009 BEARS

The story of our 6 bears is already on the web site. To update you on those bears, they are all doing great. The twins, Kaulana & Kuhilani have grown so much. Kuhilani is the largest of the two and he rules the group. The triplets are growing as well and love to wrestle. Our little Mahalo, which everyone adores isn't so tiny now and is a feisty cub. Despite the fact she is smaller than the others, she holds her own. She also has ears that stick out to the side of her head which makes her even more adorable. She is definitely a water bear - loves to dive under the water in the swim tub. This group of bears are very rough in their play, probably the roughest IBBR ever cared for over the years. There are times when we expect to see fur flying, but they seem to do okay. We did worry about Mahalo with her size and such rough playing. However, she gives as good as she gets. Even Kuhilani, the largest one of the group has backed off when she told him to "knock it off!". We expect to release all of them in December unless the other states want to wait for a spring release. We would like to hold Mahalo until spring to give her small frame time to grow. She will never be a big bear, but releasing her when she is as big as she can be without holding her past the June 2010 deadline would give her a bit more of an advantage. That will depend on whether we have other bears to winter through as we don't want to hold her by herself.

In June our long time employee, Jon Knight had to quit. He had a back and knee situation which eventually worsened with all the physical work involved. He couldn't ignore it any longer and we were all sad to see him leave. However, he fills in every now and then as needed. We posted the job on our web site, at Boise State University, and by word of mouth. We received many wonderful resumes so it was a tough decision. After interviewing all those that qualified, we hired (from left to right) Meghan Underwood, Joshua Hood, and Amy Kidwell. Due to conflicts with the work schedule IBBR needs and their availability, the three of them will job share. IBBR wanted one of them to live on site and Amy Kidwell will be that person. Wonder if anyone told her that means helping to welcome a new bear arriving at midnight!



INTERN HOUSING NIGHTMARES

After Sally Maughan's mother passed away, we converted that house into the intern house for an employee. When Jon moved out, we had the house inspected and were given the news that it would cost \$4500 to bring it up to date with the repairs and fixes needed. Sally's parents took immaculate care of the house while they were alive, but it is an old house so the news wasn't unexpected. However, the timing couldn't have been worse since there was nothing in the budget for that work. Amy needed the job and we needed to get her on site to start working so there wasn't much choice.

IBBR called on a contractor, Scott Thomson who has helped us with other projects and he stepped up right away to help with this one. Of course if you watch HGTV or any home repair shows, you know that once you start doing even the smallest of renovations there will always be bad news along the way. Our bad news turned out to be a whopper with many layers.

We have a well rather than city water and septic system rather than city sewer system. Next year we hope to fund the project to connect to Garden City's sewer system. In the meantime, the wiring and fuse box for the well was in the intern's house as was the garage and several of the buildings outside. Over the years as we added freezers and refrigerators in the buildings and garage, lighting outside, used the outside plugins more frequently, & it created an overload that kept kicking all the fuses off. We realized

we couldn't leave it that way even day longer. We have a really great electrician, John Duncan from Winters Electric. He came out and stayed with it until the job was done. In the middle of moving the wiring, the irrigation ditch pipe buried in the ground began leaking (another project for 2010) and he had to stop until we could dry out the ground where his wiring would go. Despite the setback, he got it done in a few days and moved the extra load to Sally's power pole.

That was just the beginning of the nightmares to follow. As work started on the house, we discovered the flooring under the carpet was cracking in the living room, warped in spots, and generally in bad shape. Flooring needed to be replaced throughout the house along with either new carpet or new flooring of some kind. Shortly after hearing that news, we had several days of rain and discovered the roof was leaking. It's bad enough that the garage roof is also leaking where we have a couple of our freezers. We had to tarp that roof until we could afford to fix it, but we can't tarp the intern's house as it would have to remain empty if we did that.

Thankfully we were able to repair the leaking areas in the house roof, but a new roof is obviously on the project list for some point in the future.

Sally Maughan put her car up for sale, the laptop, and took out a loan to get as much of the fixes done as possible. With that loan, we got most of the house updated and the wiring moved. Both the roof and flooring had us stopped us cold. There just wasn't one penny left to do the work.

Our most urgent and immediate goal was to meet payroll, pay expenses, and feed bears. Beyond that we still needed to raise funds to finish the intern house and pay back the loan Sally took out and gave to IBBR for the



house updates and all the electrical work. After an online and e-mail plea for help, we are FINALLY getting the house finished. We had a setback due to the flooring installation that was to take a week. After 7 weeks it still wasn't completed. IBBR fired them and our reliable contractor Scott Thompson (who was now freed up from another job) stepped in to finish the job. Add to the list - a new water heater, toilet, and sink to replace the old ones, repair the refrigerator, replace several screens on the windows and one window, replace one wall in the utility room due to the roof leak and it "appears" we are done. Considering how old the house is, it's frightening to think how much more we would have faced if Sally's folks hadn't taken such good care of it over the years. Sally was planning to pull out carpet in the cat's rooms of her place and replace them with something easier to clean. After all this with the intern's house she said the word renovation doesn't exist in her vocabulary now.

FOOD DONATIONS

Thanks to Debbie Mitchell and the staff at the Fruitland Nursery, we have some extra fruit to feed the bears. They donated apricots and peaches that they were no longer able to sell. We are hoping to see more fruit donations this fall. If you know anyone in the Treasure

Valley with fruit trees, please ask them to donate the fruit they don't use. Fall is the time when the bears get very serious about



putting on weight for hibernation. They demand a lot of food and a hungry bear is not a good thing.



We can also use sacks of Fred Meyer Chunk Style dog food. Believe it or not, bears, like people have favorite foods. If we give them small kernels of dog food they play with it rather than eat it. A lot of food gets wasted so we stick with chunk style & they prefer Fred Meyer to other brands. At this point any chunk style will have to do as that's better than nothing. Anyone have salmon or trout they wish to donate - these bears love fish! Donations of fruit, dog food, and fish can be left at the front gate any



time of day or evening. Bears also love deer or elk carcass (key word carcass). Donations can be left at the main gate of IBBR or call for directions. For any donations left at the front gate, if you include a paper with your name and address, IBBR will send you a thank you letter and picture of the bears.

With fall and winter approaching it means cubs arriving late this year will often be very underweight. To help them recover quickly, we need to stock up on formula. Normally formula is used for bottle babies, but our formula has proven an exceptional aid to turning around starvation in bears. Even our two year old starved female and Jaws, the bear with his jaw shot off lived on formula for a period of time. Formula is a specialty item and you can find

information on the web site (Bear Necessities) to order it or donate money and we'll order it.

PARTHENON ENTERTAINMENT - ANIMAL PLANET FILM

During 2009 Parthenon Entertainment visited IBBR to film a show for Animal Planet. We were happy to participate. Hopefully the program will remind the public again that rehab is a viable option state wildlife agencies can consider in their bear management plans. We don't have an air date as yet, but will post it on the web site when we know.

2008 BEARS RELEASED

During the month of June 2009, we released 6 Washington bears and 2 Oregon bears. Tom Hazdor from Wide Eye Productions went on the Washington release. Tom has filmed IBBR bears in previous years so it was fun to have him join us on this release. As part of our education program, IBBR also sponsored Alison Robinson and Kara Daniels to go on the releases. Alison & Kara are both taking wildlife courses in college. During the summer months they worked for IBBR taking care of the bears until we hired replacements for Jon Knight.
